

Charter

2. The objects of the Institute shall be to maintain and improve the standards of practice of forestry, to advance, spread and promote all aspects of forestry especially in Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, and to encourage the study of forestry. In this Our Charter and the Bylaws the expression “forestry” shall include arboriculture and all aspects of the science, economics, conservation, amenity and art of establishing, cultivating, protecting, managing, harvesting and marketing forests, woodlands and trees for economic, environmental or social outcomes. Provided that in pursuing these objects, insofar as they may be similar to those of existing Bodies incorporated by Royal Charter, the Institute shall use its best endeavours to co-operate with them and to ensure that its activities are complementary to those of such Bodies Corporate.

12. The Bylaws may direct that any matter which pursuant to this Our Charter might be prescribed or regulated in the Bylaws may be further prescribed or regulated by Regulation, provided that any such further prescription or regulation shall not be repugnant to the provisions of this Our Charter or the Bylaws. Regulations may be added to, repealed or varied in like manner to that in which they were respectively made.

13. Regulations shall be made, amended or repealed by the Council as provided in the respective Bylaws which authorise that making thereof.
